
Aristophanes: Lysistrata With Commentary



Lysistrata is one of the few surviving plays by Aristophanes. Originally performed in classical Athens in 411 BC, it is a comic account of one womans extraordinary mission to end Peloponnesian War. Lysistrata convinces the women of Greece to withhold sexual privileges from their husbands and lovers as a means of forcing the men to negotiate peace, a strategy however that inflames the battle between the sexes. The play is notable for its expose of sexual relations in a male-dominated society and for its use of double entendre both and explicit obscenities. The dramatic structure shift away from represents a conventions of Old Comedy, a trend typical of the authors career. It was produced in the same vear Thesmophoriazusae, another play with a focus on gender-based issues, just two years after Athens catastrophic defeat in the Sicilian Expedition.
