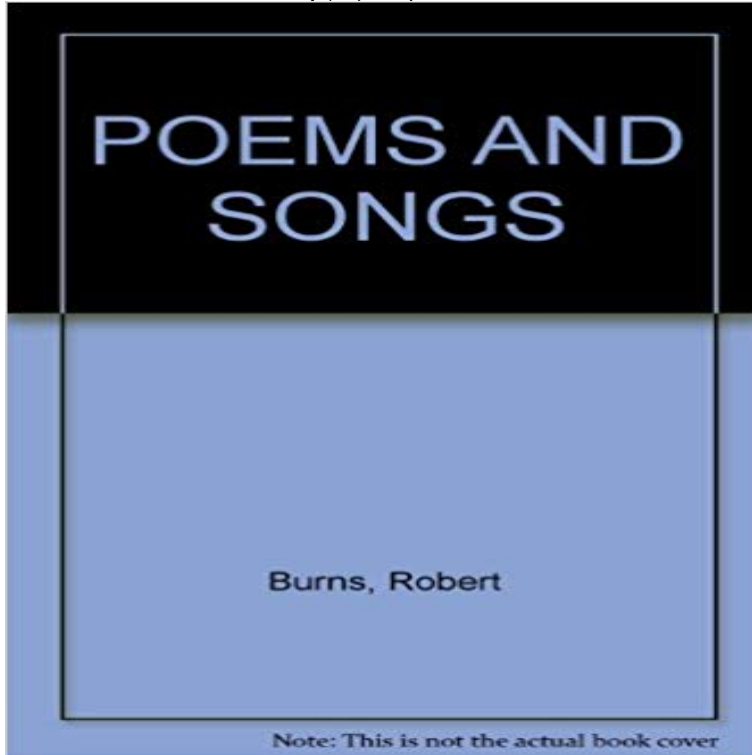


Poems and Songs, by Robert Burns

No date of publication is given, but is obviously an early edition, and includes a preface dedication of Burns To the Noblemen and Gentlemen of the Caledonian Hunt dated April 4, 1787. An engraving of a man on horseback being chased by figures faces the title page. A short sketch of the authors life (a printing error gives Burns birth year as 1795 instead of 1759) appears, and the book ends with a glossary of Scots words. The front board of the book is heavy, pressed cardboard, and carries the information of the title page in black ink with a framed border. The back board lists other publications from this publisher.
