

One of the leading female English novelists of the 19th century, Mary Ann Evans known by her pen name George Eliot, was an English novelist, journalist, translator and one of the leading writers of the Victorian era. She is the author of seven novels, including *Adam Bede* (1859), *The Mill on the Floss* (1860), *Silas Marner* (1861), *Middlemarch* (1871–72), and *Daniel Deronda* (1876), most of them set in provincial England and known for their realism and psychological insight. Quite unlike the realistic fiction for which Eliot is best known, *The Lifted Veil* explores themes of extrasensory perception, the essence of physical life, possible life after death, and the power of fate. These two novels represent a significant part of the Victorian tradition of horror fiction.
