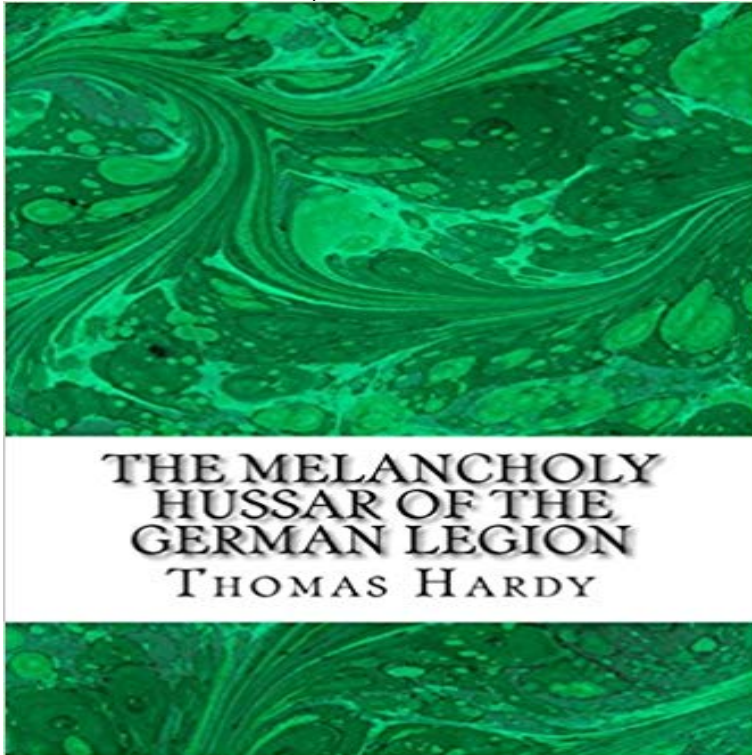


The Melancholy Hussar of the German Legion
