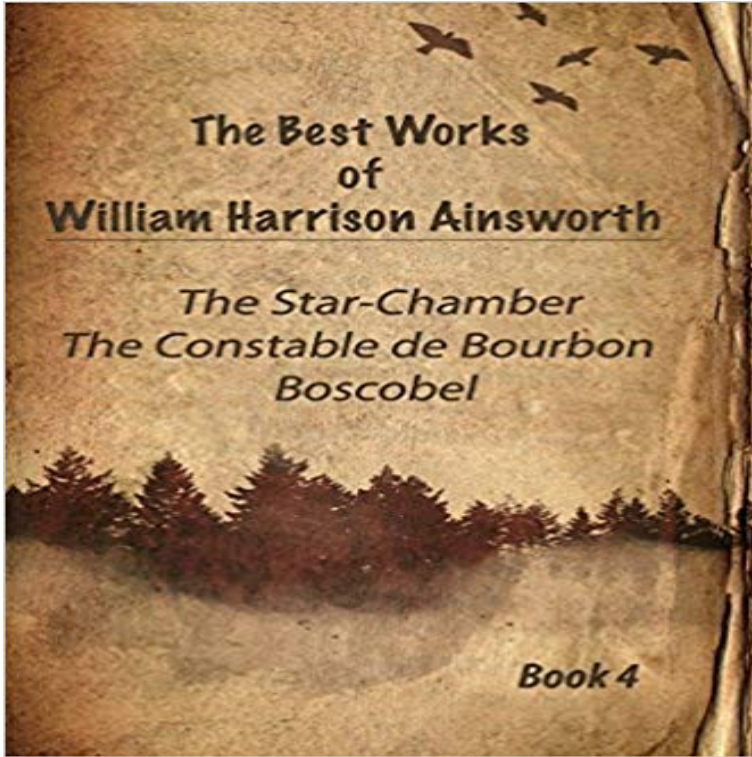

1. The Star-Chamber Published: 1854 The Star Chamber was a special court of law set up by the King of England with special powers. The Court of the Star Chamber had the power to deal with the nobles, but the Court of Star Chamber had the primary purpose to deal with political libel and treason cases.

2.
